Version 2 Revision Brief

All designs should include the following revisions.

- DO NOT include the 4-H logo within the Ariz-na. It needs to stand alone.
- The Hs in the logo need to be a solid color according to the USDA guidelines. Page 14 LINK
- Multiple color studies should be presented for each design.



A - Explore color options including teal children. Could there be another image of children standing more upright, or less evolutionary looking? Do not use rainbow coloring.



C - Explore various colors for the background. Add elements to the repeating pattern, eg: a rocket, beaker, science and computer tech. Provide separate pattern image for evaluation.



D - Focus on this design. Include a new cactus option, more visible child, night sky with 4-H themed constellations. Try color options similar to other revisions. Present at least one dark night sky. The overall theme is aspiration within a Sonoran Desert theme.
